CA HUMANE MAKES A DIFFERENCE IN THE COMMUNITY: Serving Animals and Families, but they need your help!

Red Deer, AB – The Central Alberta Humane Society (CA Humane), a leading animal welfare organization that focuses on companion animal rehabilitation and rehoming in Central Alberta, continues to make a significant impact on the community through its diverse range of services aimed at supporting both companion animals and families.

CA Humane is not government funded and while they do receive some municipal support, this only covers 8% of their annual operating costs. To sustain their endeavors, they depend on revenue from adoptions, donations, fundraisers, and sponsorships. However, amidst rising operational and resource expenses, they are facing significant challenges.

"We are very thankful the City of Red Deer and it's council for passing our loan deferral request for 2024." said Executive Director, Eve Sira. "It gives us some relief, but with the rising costs of medications, utilities, food and supplies, we continue to struggle to make the ends meet as the need for our services continue to escalate.

"Sadly, we seem to always be at capacity for dogs and cats, and our wait lists grow daily as more people find themselves homeless, unable to afford pet care, or unable to find pet-friendly accommodations.

"There is no dedicated government funding and few grant opportunities or support for animal welfare organizations, regardless of the educational, physical and mental health support that companion animals give people and families. Our utilities alone average \$10,000/month, our reserves are depleted, and we have cut business hours to save money. These tough decisions not only affect our dedicated team, and it also decreases opportunities for the public to come meet the animals in our shelter. Providing care and new homes for these fur kids is the reason we are all here."

You may have also heard that the CA Humane Executive Director took a pay cut. She did this on her own accord to help the shelter, but also to support the staff who work hard in the trenches making barely par or below industry standard for their positions, and they do so for their love of helping these animals have a better life.

CA Humane extends its services to the Central Alberta community through various programs including low-income and assistance programs, all at minimal or no cost to families. These initiatives include the "Helping Paws" Pet Food Bank, an Emergency Boarding Program, and a subsidized spay/neuter program.

CA Humane's key initiatives encompass providing essential medical care to injured companion animals, pet rehoming services, comprehensive pet adoption procedures, pet lost and found services, inclusive volunteer programs, humane education programs, facilitating dog licensing for the City of Red Deer, and dignified pet cremation services. CA Humane does not bring in animals from other provinces, but rather focuses on assisting the high animal population in Alberta,

Through these endeavors, CA Humane not only serves the immediate needs of animals in Central Alberta but also fosters a culture of compassion and responsible pet ownership within the community. CA Humane is an integral part of the community and they need the public's support to continue to provide these services in Central Alberta.

- ➤ We do as many procedures as possible in house including dental work, amputations, spay & neuter, abscess removal, etc to save money outsourcing animal care.
- We implement a comprehensive recycling program that encompasses wet food cans, plastics, bottles, and more, ensuring sustainability and environmental responsibility.
- Monthly donations help us immensely! Only \$10 per month can help us daily to treat animals in care.
